Benefits of working in the NHS, UK

Pay: A newly registered nurse would come under Band 5 category and earn a starting salary of £25,655 per annum. Pay enhancements are available to reward out of shift hours and overtime working.

*Please note that the Band 5 salary for Registered Nurses is the same in every NHS Trust across the UK.

Annual Leave: Staff are entitled to a minimum of 27 days of annual leave, increasing to 29 days after five years of service and 33 days after ten years of service, plus general public holidays.

Work-Life Balance: In order to maintain a healthy work and life balance, reduce stress, and improve productivity among staff, the organization implemented a flexible work system consisting of part-time roles, job-share options, evening & weekend positions etc.

Pension Schemes: Every new employee automatically becomes a member, and you will get an excellent package of pension benefits, fully protected against inflation and guaranteed by the government..

Health & Wellbeing: The health and well-being of staff are of utmost importance to NHS. The organization provides a wide range of services to support the cause.

Registered Nurse in the UK

Every nurse employed in the UK should be in the registers of the Nursing and Midwiferry Council (NMC). The NMC follows stringent norms in the verification and scrutiny of the documents submitted by every applicant for the registration process. To be eligible to initiate the registration process with the NMC, a nurse should fulfil the following prerequisites:

► Eligible Qualifications: GNM/ B.Sc /Post B.Sc /M.Sc (Nursing)

▶ English Proficiency Certificate IELTS/ UKVI IELTS (Academic) with minimum scores of 6.5 in Writing and 7 in Listening, Reading and Speaking (or)

OET with minimum scores of C+ in Writing and B in Listening, Reading and Speaking

(or)

Registration and practice of at least one year in a country where English is the first and native language.

Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust is a world-renowned centre of clinical excellence and one of the largest NHS teaching trusts in the UK. The Trust is made up of four hospitals-the John Radcliffe Hospital (which includes the Children's Hospital, West Wing, Eye Hospital, Heart Centre and Women's Centre), the Churchill Hospital and the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre, all located in Oxford, and the Horton General Hospital in Banbury, north Oxfordshire.

The Trust provides a wide range of clinical services, specialist services (including cardiac, cancer, musculoskeletal and neurological rehabilitation), medical education, training and research. These services are delivered from the Trust's main hospitals, with 6% of the services delivered from 44 additional locations in the region and from patients' homes.

The Trust's collaboration with the University of Oxford underpins the quality of care that is provided to patients, from the delivery of high-quality research, bringing innovation from the laboratory bench to the bedside, to the delivery of high-quality education and training of doctors.

The Trust employs about 12,500 staff which includes almost 4000 nurses and midwives, and 1,700 doctors.

John Radcliffe Hospital

The John Radcliffe Hospital (JR) (which includes the Children's Hospital, West Wing, Eye Hospital, Heart Centre and Women's Centre) is Oxfordshire's main accident and emergency site. The JR provides acute medical and surgical services, including trauma, intensive care, infectious diseases, chest medicine, and cardiothoracic services. It is situated in Headington, about three miles east of Oxford city centre. It is the largest of the Trust's hospitals, covering around 66 acres, and includes:

Children's Hospital

Most children's services in Oxford are based at the Children's hospital, a purpose-built environment for children. The Children's hospital delivers a wide range of specialty services for children through-out the Thames Valley and beyond. Services are largely provided by paediatricians and surgeons with particular paediatric specialist interests, and also with the general paediatric service.

Eye Hospital

The Oxford Eye Hospital is a busy teaching hospital, with a team of more than 10 Consultant Ophthalmologists covering a wide range of sub-specialties, including: vitreoretinal, glaucoma, paediatric, neuro-ophthalmology and more.

Heart Centre

The Oxford Heart Centre is a centre of excellence for treating people with heart disease. It is supported by an internationally renowned academic department of cardiovascular medicine.

West Wing

The West Wing provides modern, high-quality and purpose-built accommodation for adult services, including neurosciences, specialist surgery, neuro critical care, day surgery and more.



Women's Centre

More than 8,000 babies are born in the Women's Centre every year. The centre is theregional referral unit for women with high-risk pregnancies and their Neonatal unit provides special care for babies in Oxfordshire and across the South east. The John Radcliffe site also houses many departments of Oxford University Medical School and is home to the George Pickering Education Centre. The site also acts as a base for most medical students who are trained throughout the Trust.

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Churchill Hospital

The Churchill Hospital is a centre of excellence for cancer services and other specialties, including renal services and transplants, clinical and medical oncology, dermatology, haemophilia, medical genetics and palliative care. The hospital, together with the nearby John Radcliffe Hospital, is a major centre for healthcare research, housing departments of Oxford University Medical School and Oxford Brookes University's School of Healthcare studies.

Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre

The Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre has been treating patients with bone and joint problems for more than 80 years. It has a world-wide reputation for excellence in orthopaedics, rheumatology and rehabilitation. The hospital also undertakes specialist services, such as the treatment of bone infection and bone tumours, limb reconstruction and the rehabilitation of those with limb amputation or complex neurological disabilities.

Horton General Hospital

Situated in Banbury (about 30 miles from Oxford city centre), The Horton General Hospital serves the growing population in the north of Oxfordshire and its surrounding areas. It has both inpatient and day-case beds, and also provides outpatient clinics. It is an acute general hospital, providing a wide range of services. The outpatient department runs clinics with visiting consultants from Oxford in dermatology, neurology, physical medicine, rheumatology, ophthalmology, radiotherapy, oral surgery and paediatric cardiology.

With over 160,000 citizens, Oxford is certainly a much-loved city. So, what is it that makes Oxford so popular with both residents and visitors?


Beautiful surroundings
